



Ordinance Number 1

An Ordinance related to Disorderly Persons

THE VILLAGE OF FREEPORT ORDAINS:

Section 1. No person in the Village of Freeport shall:

- (1) CONCEALED WEAPONS. Wear under his clothes, or conceal about his person, or display in a threatening manner, and dangerous weapon, including, but not by way of limitation, any pistol, revolver, slingshot, cross-knuckle or knuckles of lead, brass or other metal, or any knife resembling a bowie knife or a razor, or any knife with a switchblade or device whereby the blade or blades can be opened by a flick of a button, pressure on the handle or other mechanical contrivance.
- (2) DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE. Disturb, or tend to disturb, excite to disturb or aid in disturbing the peace of the city of any part thereof, or the quiet of any family or person by loud or unusual notice or by shouting, cursing, quarreling, challenging to fight, fighting, riot or enticing to riot, or by violent, tumultuous offensive obstreperous or other disorderly conduct in any public place or place of lawful assembly and no person shall knowingly permit such conduct upon any premises owned or possessed by him or under his control.
- (3) ENTICING INTO AN AUTOMOBILE. Accost a person or endeavor to entice a person into an automobile.
- (4) ASSULT. Engage in fighting or any way commit an assault and battery upon a person.
- (5) ILLEGAL OR IMMORAL CONDUCT. Engage in any illegal or improper diversion or in any indecent, insulting, immoral or obscene conduct in any street, alley or public place or elsewhere in the Village of Freeport.
- (6) JOSTLING. Jostle or roughly crowd people unnecessarily in any street, alley or public place.
- (7) LOITERING. Loiter in and about any street, alley, park, public parking lot, doorway, stairway, vestibule, bank, cigar store, restaurant, café, garage, tavern, beer garden, pool room, hall, church, theater, place of amusement, or any place of public resort, or wander in and about the premises of others without being able to give a satisfactory of himself or herself.
- (8) MALICIOUS DESCTRUTION. Willfully, maliciously, wantonly, negligently or otherwise disturb, deface, injure, destroy, or remove real property or improvements thereto or any movable or personal property belong to the city or to any person.

(9) PROFANITY AND INDECENT LANGUAGE. Use of profane, indecent, obscene or improper language in any public place or where such languages may be heard by persons in a public place.

(10) ENAGE IN PROSTITUTION. Solicit for prostitution in any place in the Village of Freeport or keep or frequent a place where prostitution is practiced, encouraged or allowed.

(11) RESISITING AN OFFICER. Resist any officer, or any person duly empowered with police authority, while in the discharge of his duties, or shall in any way interfere with or hinder him in the discharge of his duties.

(12) SCATTER RUBISH. Throw or permit, be deposed or scattered upon any sidewalk, street, alley or upon any private property, any waste, garbage or other material of any kind.

SECTION 2. No person in the Village of Freeport shall fire off or set off without the prior consent of the Council, any gunpowder, firecracker, or fireworks, or fire off any gun, pistol or canon, or throw any fireball, or aid and abet therein.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance may be enforced by any duly sworn Police Officer in the State of Michigan.

SECTION 4. Any person violating the provisions of Section 1 or Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be deemed a disorderly person and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed ONE HUNDRED & 00/000 (\$100.00) Dollars and the cost of prosecution or by imprisonment in the County jail not to exceed NINETY (90) days or both fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 5. Any ordinances or parts of ordinates in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. Should any sections or subsections of this ordinance be declared invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof.

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after twenty days from the date of passage.
