



Ordinance Number 14

An ordinance to regulate and license peddlers within the Village of Freeport as amended March , 1975

The Village of Freeport ordains:

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, partnership, or corporation to sell, offer for sale, dispose of at auction, or hawk, cry or sell from place to place or house to house for cash, credit or other means of conveyance, any goods, wares, items of merchandise or other materials, in or on any public street, alley or area inside the village of Freeport, Barry County Michigan; or from any stand, stall, cart, wagon pack or basket from any temporary structure booth or shelter, erected within the Village of Freeport, or from any motor vehicle or wheeled conveyance parked within said limits, without first applying for and obtaining from the office of the village clerk of Freeport, a license to do so at the following rates:

- House to House peddling or soliciting.....\$3.00 a day
- Street vending.....\$5.00 a day
- Auction in street, public area or temporary shelter or structure.....\$10.00 a day
- Traveling Merchant or Transient Dealer.....\$30.00 or agreed fee

SECTION 2. Provided that these requirements shall not apply to any person residing within the Village limits of Freeport, or any partnership or corporation located within the Village of Freeport or to the sale or distribution of farm, garden or orchard products that are offered for sale by the person producing the same, including eggs, butter, cream, milk, fresh vegetables, berries, fruit and like products.

SECTION 3. Any person violating the terms of this ordinance shall be convicted thereof, etc.

All conflicting ordinances are hereby repealed.

Severance Clause

Any person engaged in selling any product from door to door within the Village limits shall obtain a permit from the Village Clerk for a fee of Two dollars (\$2.00).

This ordinance amends Ordinance No. 14 enacted December 4th, 1922 and shall take effect ,1975
